PARKING, SHUTTLES, AND TRAFFIC

PARKING
Off street parking along Main Street is available at the Bath Pharmacy lot and at Fast Freddy's grassy area.

An Event Parking Lot is available on Church Street next to Bath Public School.

Accessible Parking is available at Bath Public School with a sticker.

Parking available for **Parade Participants only** at Bath Public School.

Academy Street is the Emergency Route and must be kept open to 2way traffic. Please respect the barriers.

A FREE BUS SHUTTLE will run from Sir John Johnson to the corner of Church and Main with stops at Bath Family Pharmacy and Fast Freddy's Parking area. The bus will start at Sir John Johnson at 9:30 am and do a continuous loop until 5:30 pm. The service will stop between 1 to 2 pm for the Parade.

A 2nd **FREE BUS SHUTTLE** will run from the Event Parking area north of Bath School to the Church Street Park.

TRAFFIC FLOW
All Day Road Closure: Church Street Between Academy and the Event Parking Area.

Temporary Road Closure: 12-2 From Finkle's Shore Park on Main Street to Bath Public School on Church Street. Directions for bypassing Bath on Canada Day can be found at bathcanadaday.com.

Selfless, non assuming, giving of themselves to provide for many in all seasons."

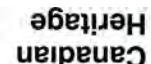
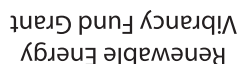
Another supporter describes them as "People who spend 90% of their lives paying it forward".

Karen came to Canada and Bath as a landed immigrant. Shortly after she arrived a neighbour told her that the interior of St John's Church was in dire need of re-plastering. Karen knew how to do that. When it was finished, the Anglican Church Women presented her with a warm winter coat and the means to apply for her citizenship. She knew then that she had found her home.

Most people would recognize Karen and Roxanne as the architects of the Annual Community Christmas Dinner. The latest version of this dinner began in 2014 when sixty people enjoyed turkey and trimmings in the warm and welcoming atmosphere of St. John's Hall or in the comfort of their own home.

In 2019, 300 people were seated for dinner, 40 meals were picked up and 21 deliveries were made. They kept going throughout COVID and with the able assistance of volunteers and drivers, delivered 348 meals to peoples' homes.

This year the theme for Bath Canada Day is Planting Seeds for Change. It symbolizes the actions that each of us can take to make our community and the world a healthier, more inclusive and sustainable place to be. We can't think of two other people who have planted so many seeds of kindness in this community.
