L&A OPP are responsible for supporting court proceedings at two court houses located in the Town of Napanee.



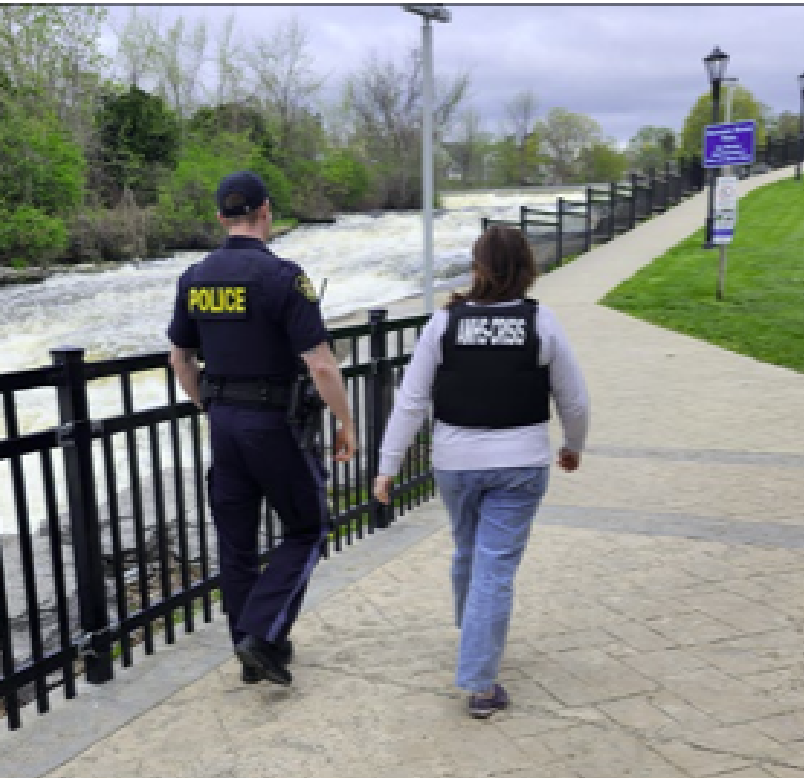
In 2024, Mobile Crises Response Team received over 4,000 contacts or actions.

Mobile Crisis Response Team

These members form the Mobile Crisis Response Team (MCRT). They respond with police to police received calls where individuals may be facing a mental health crisis.

In 2024 MCRT received over 4,000 contacts or actions. They personally followed up with 1,200 individuals facing mental health issues and responded to 2,500 phone calls or texts from persons seeking assistance.
